Good morning, Dr. Golla and Dr. Aguilar,

Thank you again for taking the time to talk with us about forming an ASSP Student Section at Texas A&M University – San Antonio last Friday!

We are really excited about the opportunity to work with you both toward this goal!

As mentioned during the meeting, there is a two-fold, asynchronous process for how to form a new ASSP Student Section.

The official process is outlined in the Student Section Formation Kit (see attached), however here is the abbreviated version of the outline:

ASSP South Texas Chapter	Potential Student Section
1.The "Parent" Chapter has to be willing and able to support the formation of a Student Section. (i.e., not only from a financial standpoint, but it also needs to be able to provide mentorship and professional guidance to these students)	1.The accredited college/university OHS Department needs to support the formation of a new student organization on their campus. Therefore, they will have to follow their campus' policy and procedures to officially petition to become a registered student organization.
2.Once the Student Section has been recognized as a registered student organization, the members of the South Texas Chapter will need to approve the Student Section's petition in order to move forward and become their Parent Chapter.	2.Student Section must select a Faculty Advisor who is an active member of ASSP. (NOTE: Your Executive Committee can vote to pay for the Faculty Advisor's dues.)
3.Next, the Student Section Formation Checklist will need to be completed by the Chapter's appointed Student Section Liaison and the Student Section's Faculty Advisor.	3.Student Section can only begin by recruiting a minimum of ten (10) dues-paying students. (NOTE: Your Executive Committee can vote to pay for the inaugural group's dues = \$15/student x 10 students = \$150.)
4.The South Texas Chapter will work with Society Staff to draft the required paperwork to present at the next Regional Operating Committee (ROC) Meeting for the ROC Members to vote and approve the Parent Chapter's adoption of the newly formed Student Section.	4.Student Section will need to hold nominations and elections for their Leadership Positions (i.e., includes 3 to 4 positions: President, Vice-President, Treasur

- September 1973, the South Texas Chapter addressed changes in the Worker's Compensation Laws with a presentation from Mr. Hugh Stelly. The turn out was very good with lively discussions.
- September 1973 Bill King, President of the South Texas Chapter, spent time reviewing the Code of Ethics. Issues had arisen from the Region III ROC meeting about Ethics after guidance from ASSE Society was provided.




